# PLEASE HELP RESTORE LAMBDA

With stronger support from graduate brothers, Lambda Chapter will continue to strengthen. Your support is critical, especially to help our undergraduate brothers seek career direction, to improve academically, and for us to recruit more new members and restore the chapter's financial position.

Graduate brothers are a vital part of Lambda's recovery. Unfortunately, a lack of graduate support has inhibited recruitment and the ability for the chapter to share vital information about Lambda's traditions and expectations of its brothers. Imagine an undergrad's life at Fiji without graduates who care about them, to explain how Fiji has remained as a leading fraternity for decades because the chapter expects to be among the best. It may seem unlikely, but what if Fiji didn't set that example for you during your time there? Would you have performed as well without that guidance?

Lambda has had a recent surge in graduate brothers' participation, but we need more. Our new House Director, "JJ" Johnson, has also bolstered the chapter's self-governance. More specific needs are listed below. Financial challenges continue, but momentum is rising. We need you now!

New support from graduate brothers boosted the undergrads' morale and enthusiasm for building relationships with their new recruits.

Daniel Grad's recruiting team used the methods brought in by Phired Up to begin building friendships with freshmen as soon as they arrived on campus.

 They created a database of contacts and comments about them that greatly improved the team's ability to identify and track progress about each prospective new member (PNM) across the chapter's members. The chapter added nine members so far and continues to recruit. Several more are anticipated to join, and a plan is in place to reach sophomores who reconsider after their dorm friends affiliate.

Phi Gamma Delta's New Model initiates immediately, providing post-initiation education (PIE) and Lambda's lore and traditions, which enables them to see the values and heritage of the fraternity and removes the potential incentive for hazing during pledgeship. Lambda was a New Model "pilot" chapter with IHQ three years ago.

Graduate brothers have stepped up to counsel undergrads about careers, job searching and Cabinet functions, but we need more guys!

- · Please give me a call, text, or e-mail if you're able to be a contact on specific careers; the undergraduates are hungry to learn and to gain understanding about your work.
- Please seriously consider a financial contribution. \$5,000 is not

too much to ask for, and the benefits greatly exceed the cost to your retirement fund. 2024's more-than-20% gains make it so! Lambda still needs at least \$100,000 to operate in 2026. Twenty graduates need to step up!

Brother Eric Wolfe, Lambda '04, the leading realtor in Putnam County, is offering the use of an apartment for groups of Fiji graduate brothers to spend selected weekends together at a nominal cost. It's a great opportunity to reconnect with each other while we assist the chapter's members.

Here are more specific ways that graduate brothers, including you, are needed to bring Lambda back to its full mission, developing young guys into leaders and preparing them for life after DePauw:

- · Expand Lambda's recruitment strategy.
  - Join Lambda's Recruitment Committee with Phired Up. Begin to coach with them.
  - Summer Rush activities: Plan Lambda's August kickoff with undergraduates. (Lists of new students are not made available until then.)
- · BCA development: Mark Thurow is our new Purple Legionnaire. He needs our help.
  - Get with Cabinet to define their needs, including chapter treasurer functions, etc.
  - Discuss the chapter's needs among graduate brothers and seek volunteers.
  - Follow up to get them to plan some weekend events to schedule with the chapter.
  - Provide IHQ materials to new BCA members.
  - Plan career and post-graduation sessions.
  - Build a list of careers and career stories with names of Lambda graduates.
  - Build a program of weekend sessions to build mutual interest in the topic.
  - Build a schedule into the chapter calendar and schedule graduate brother attendees.
  - Graduate brothers and a large segment of the undergrads meet for career-related discussions on Saturday afternoon, on sales, computer science, HR, business management, entrepreneurship, etc.
- · Gather e-mail addresses from graduate brothers to expand Tiger Fiji and e-letter circulation.
  - You can help support more frequent, timely communications with Lambda brothers — important!
