House Update: The Inside's Done, Curb Appeal is Next!

With the construction equipment gone and the renovation now complete, a major upgrade to Phi Gam's outside appearance is next. Here is a quick recap of the overall project so far, and the remaining improvements.

Recap So Far

Renovation and addition: \$2.7 million \$1.2 million Graduate donations: Current mortgage balance: \$1.5 million \$200,000 Mortgage reduction: (Required by September 1, 2019)

Parking lots, alley removal, and landscaping (see picture above):

A significant portion of the mortgage reduction is expected through ongoing undergraduate housebills, without an increase beyond DePauw's room and board rates, and some additional income from incoming pledge payments is expected to contribute to the landscaping and paving efforts.

Announcement!

The alley is going away!! We have obtained Greencastle's permission to close it. Lambda has done the largest fraternity renovation/expansion project at DePauw since it erected its new house in 1965, and it is ready to complete the most visible part a unified 200-foot property, with paved rear parking and landscaping details that enhance its curb appeal.


