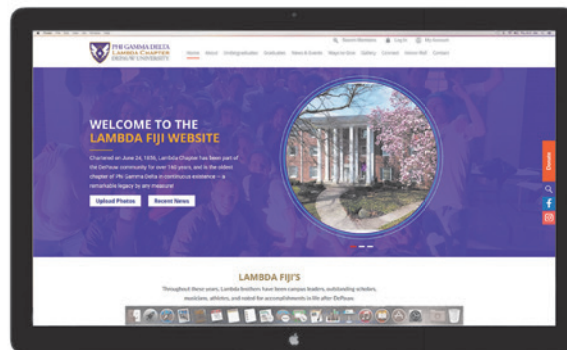

## Thank You, Volunteers!

It would be impossible to identify all of the work that Lambda FIJI volunteers have done over the last twenty weeks. Suffice it to say, work on all of the issues surrounding DePauw's early closure in the spring semester and opening in late August has involved members of the FIJI Cabinet, House Corporation, Board of Chapter Advisors, House Directors, Property Manager, and a number of other willing FIJI volunteers. The list of folks involved would take a page, so we'll have to settle for a huge thanks to dozens of people.

Many issues had to be dealt with and decisions made during the past weeks to help keep FIJI "up and running." This group of FIJI volunteers has conducted weekly conference calls over this time period and probably hundreds of additional calls and meetings with DePauw personnel, the Greek Community Board (GCB), FIJI International Headquarters (IHQ), Lambda FIJI alums, and dozens of current and future vendors including the insurance company, cleaning vendors, building contractors, new communications vendors, lawyers, food service vendors, and the list goes on.

This dedicated group of people managed and coordinated:

- The early closure and move-out of the chapter this spring.
- The financial challenge of refunding money to the early-departing undergraduates.
- Repair of some damaged areas of the house.
- A disastrous water pipe burst that wiped out a significant part of the new chapter library (*insured!*).
- Weeks of planning with DePauw regarding the implications of opening this fall semester.
- Hiring a new house director.
- Selecting a new graduate communications service company.
- Selecting a new food service plan and contract involving partnerships with two sororities on campus.
- Financial planning that involved dealing with a significant loss of returning undergraduates.
- The establishment of a new Lambda FIJI Emergency Fund.
- Deep cleaning the house to meet new COVID-19 standards.
- Reconfiguring the furniture in the study rooms and the first floor to meet the new COVID-19 standards.
- Providing new house usage policies and signage to meet COVID-19 standards.
- Designing documents describing FIJI opening policies and health and wellness guidelines.
- Designing a new member-recruitment strategy.
- Defining new alumni communications plans including website redesign, *Tiger FIJI* content and schedules, database design and update processes, the formation of a FIJI Presidents' Council, and a new schedule for alumni emails.
- Assuring that FIJI complies with all the new DePauw policies and practices that are in place for the fall semester.
- Redesigning all the major Lambda FIJI legal contracts dealing with undergraduates and employees.
- Establishing new fall move-in dates, times, and check-in procedures.
- Maintaining continuous contact with the undergraduate brothers to help ensure their well-being.

As you probably know, DePauw chose to open for the fall semester with significantly fewer students on campus. The University canceled all fall sports and a significant number of student activities. This was accompanied by completely redesigned student housing and food services, a new COVID-19 emergency plan, a new academic calendar, and a new curriculum that heavily features "distance learning" course offerings.

It remains to be seen how all this will play out over the fall semester. As we pen this short article, many questions remain unanswered. Regardless, our stance has been and always will be: "We are resolved that as long as DePauw University remains, Lambda Chapter fully intends to be here."

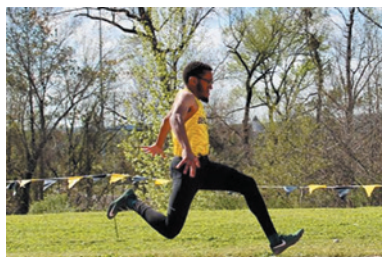

The current state of the chapter, like many things at the moment, is up in the air due to the pandemic. Because of DePauw's strict new guidelines and the decision to only allow freshmen and sophomores back on campus for the fall (along with select juniors and seniors), the chapter is operating at a fraction of its normal budget.

When we began our projections of how many brothers would be living in the chapter house last spring, we planned for 35 brothers; in reality, we only have 23. This is a severe financial blow to Lambda FIJI.

And yet, we have some things to celebrate. For the first time in many years, our chapter is the second largest on campus! We fully intend to take advantage of the edge that this will offer during recruitment. The fact that we're the second-largest chapter on campus by such a wide margin speaks volumes to the character and grit of our brotherhood. Phi Gamma Delta men at DePauw chose to come back to campus to face our challenges together, united as one, rather than go it alone. Many brothers made this critical decision specifically with the survival of our chapter in mind.



Above all else during this difficult season, I am seeking the advice and guidance of our graduates. **If there was ever a time the brotherhood needed your support, that time is now.** Whether you're able to give your time, talent, or treasure back to the chapter, your contribution is greatly appreciated. One thing is certain: our current volunteers can't combat this alone.

## HONORING A LEGEND

### Brother Judson Green '74 (1952 - 2020)

It is with great sadness that we report the loss of Distinguished Lambda FIJI Graduate **Judson Green** on Monday, August 31, 2020. Judson passed peacefully at his home in Orlando after complications related to a stem cell transplant. Judson had been battling cancer since 2008. He is survived by his wife, Joyce, his son, his daughter, and his three grandchildren.

In a recent letter, DePauw President Lori White wrote, "No words can adequately convey the deep and profound loss this institution has suffered with the death of Judson C. Green '74. Truly 'gold within,' Judson, a Trustee since 1996, and former Chairman of Walt Disney Attractions, Inc., served DePauw in a myriad of ways. DePauw's Board Chairman in 2001-2004, Judson Green was instrumental in the financing and revitalization of DePauw's School of Music and in other University endeavors, and heavily invested in boosting



the appeal of downtown Greencastle for our students and the whole community, just to name a few. In fact, the latest project Judson and his wife Joyce launched to benefit both DePauw and the city, Breadworks by Bridges, is still under construction. Judson Green was as approachable as he was generous and as creative as he was pragmatic. He leaves an everlasting imprint on the University in the beautiful Performing Arts Center that bears his and Joyce's names in the spirit that imbues every music student who benefits from his generosity. He was a dedicated son of our Old Gold. The DePauw community joins the

Greens in mourning the loss of our dear friend."

Judson was awarded the Robert C. McDermond Medal for Excellence in Entrepreneurship from DePauw in 1997 and the Old Gold Goblet in 2011. He was the 1999 commencement speaker.

In his distinguished career, Judson worked for Disney for nearly 20 years. He rose through the ranks to become CFO and, in 1991, President of Walt Disney Attractions.

As a loyal FIJI alum, Judson supported Lambda Chapter's Capital Campaign and was named one of the first recipients of the Distinguished Lambda FIJI Award. He also received the Phi Gamma Delta Educational Foundation's Distinguished FIJI award in October 2014. He is remembered with great fondness by his FIJI brothers. Rest in Peace, Judson.
