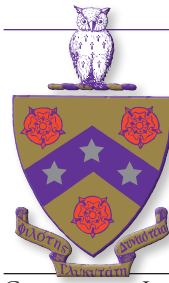

From his design and art contributions to his generous financial support and poignant remarks at our 2017 Pig Dinner, it's clear he's also passionate about FIJI.

When I was being recruited to the house, I had the opportunity to speak with Tom via zoom, and his commitment to the house became instantly apparent. After getting elected Corresponding Secretary, I've spoken with him even more. Tom's deep feeling for FIJI, as I learned after interviewing him, comes from a place of gratitude for the supportive and encouraging environment of

brotherhood that enabled him to succeed.

Tom is from Blue Island, IL, a small town just south of Chicago. Somewhat ironically, he wanted to attend Tulane, but after his parents insisted he come to DePauw, he fell in love with the school and never considered leaving.

Tom studied Political Science and English, then went to law school at Georgetown University. Eventually, he changed careers and studied architecture and design at Parsons School of Design. One of my questions for Tom was what he did when he was bored, to which he responded, "I was rarely bored, except taking French. Studies and FIJI activities filled my life."

When I started asking Tom about his student days, I could feel that connection that comes with shared experience. He told me how the guys at FIJI challenged and encouraged him to come out of his shell,

which I completely related to. There were more similarities, like our shared admiration for the upper-class brothers who influenced us and our love of the immersive experience of being with people from different backgrounds. But Tom's deep passion really showed when he opened up to me about why he gives back to the house—"if just one other person can be impacted the way I was, it's more than worth it."

Several paintings on the first floor of the house by DePauw art students were made possible by Tom, as well as all the furnishings for the new ground-floor library and study lounge and the expanded foyer, which he donated in memory of his class brother Terry Etter. Tom shared with me that without FIJI he "wouldn't have developed the confidence to believe in himself and constantly leap into the unknown to achieve a fulfilling and meaningful life." His generosity inspires gratitude in myself and all of my brothers, and his passion makes all the difference in the world.

Luke joined Lambda because he felt "it was a safe place to be yourself, to grow and to be creative." He enjoys walking down the hall and having a conversation with any one of his brothers. "The brothers always have an interesting backstory from which I learn something useful."
