Letter from the HC President

Dear Brother,

Here's a follow up to the letter I sent you in mid-December:

- Campaign: 50 brothers responded with donations totaling \$112,000 out of the \$300,000 we need to absorb our occupancy deficit until it can rise from 23 to 33, our breakeven point. We're well on our way, but please do seriously consider joining in to save the chapter.
- **Rush:** DePauw enrolled 499 first year students, down 1 from last year. Enrollment was 1656 last spring, 1658 this year. Fraternity Rush participants numbered 156, 5 less than last year and 136 pledged. FIJI has taken 8 through formal Rush, and intends to reach 10 through open bids, raising our occupancy to 27 in fall 2024-25, after graduating 4 seniors. This is the number we had planned, on our way to 33 occupancy for 2025-26. We will graduate 9 after 2024-25 ends.
- **Phired Up consultants**: Jayson Davis provided 2 workshops and ongoing counseling during the recent recruitment season, funded by an anonymous HC member. The spirit was strong as the chapter competed against larger houses. We have begun outlining the schedule for next year's recruitment coaching with Phired Up, to ramp up next year's effort.

Chapter Retreat February 17: House Corp met with the Chapter to meet the new members and discuss recruitment, and met with the new Cabinet as to the challenges of the upcoming semester, to develop an approach to Business & Leadership School students and to improve graduate communications. HC offered to respond to requests about job searches and networking, and intends to reach Graduate Brothers to help support this function. As May, 2024 approaches, and our funding dwindles, I'm asking you to examine the value lost if Lambda Chapter cannot survive at DePauw versus the cost of making a contribution that preserves it. Was Lambda Chapter as instrumental for you in developing lasting friendships, learning life skills, and helping you succeed in college as it was for me? If so, then please help the next generation enjoy those benefits. And do you really want to come for alumni reunions at DePauw and join your brothers at the Union Building, or elsewhere? Frankly, we face a go/no decision point as this school year ends in May. What message do you want to send the chapter?

There are Many Ways to Make a Contribution

The ways to donate are below:

IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions:

Alumni older than 70-1/2 can transfer up to \$105,000 per year from your traditional IRAs to charity, (Lambda Chapter Educational Fund) which can count as their required minimum distribution (RMD) <u>but</u> is not taxable if you follow the rules for a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).
